## **Gospel Meditation: The Samaritan Woman**

The Scripture readings for next week (Sunday of the Man Born Blind) are: Acts 16:16-34 & John 9:1-38

Jesus heard that they had cast him out, and having found him he said, "Do you believe in the Son of man?" He answered, "And who is he, sir, that I may believe in him?" Jesus said to him, "You have seen him, and it is he who speaks to you." He said, "Lord, I believe"; and he worshiped him.

In part of his conversation with the Samaritan woman, Jesus states that "an

hour is coming and is already here, when authentic worshippers will worship the Father in Spirit and truth." Jacob's well was not only a source for life-supporting water but the mountain which contained that well was also a site on which the Samaritan people could go to worship God. Yet, as the woman pointed out, the Israelite race of people claimed that Jerusalem is the place where men ought to worship God. Obviously, both traditions are correct but worshipping God is not limited to just these two areas. God dwells and may be worshipped anywhere in the Universe but "looking we may not always see and listening we may

not always hear." So how does one communicate with God under such shaky conditions? The proper way which grants us the most assurance of finding Christ and his life-giving waters is by seeking him in our life long traditions and customs. If we look very closely at the opening verses of the Gospel passage we see that Jesus was already at the well waiting for the Samaritan woman to return to the area which was her traditional site for communicating with God. The practice of traditions and the following of family customs appears to the present generations as extra "baggage" that weighs us down and hinders our growth. Many believe that Christ can only be found by following our emotions and in the "free expression" of self. Nothing could be more contrary to the truth and to freedom. Christ cannot be found in the "free expression" of self since he is not present there in the first place. Rather, we must first find him and his source of life-giving water in our traditional expressions of worship. Only by embracing our family customs and traditions of worship can we have free expression of self and also worship the Father in Spirit and truth. God if Spirit and worshipping God in Spirit means to always bear witness to His teachings whether in church or out of church. An hour is coming or may already be here, in which we will not be able to worship God in the church. Because of circumstances beyond our control we will only be able to worship God in Spirit and truth. Often times we are unable to attend church because of a nursing baby or sick children. We may be away at school and unable to attend our traditional services. We may be confined to a hospital bed or we may have family responsibilities. Even alone on a date we still bear witness of His teaching and worship God in Spirit and truth. Of course, many times Christ does seek us out and is able to find us no matter how far we might have strayed from the beaten path of traditional customs and proper behavior, but in all cases it is only to guide us back to that source of life-giving water of which we will "never be thirsty again."
