Christ the Light of the World By Msgr. John T. Sekellick

A drive through our city streets and neighborhoods at this time of year in the evening hours and at night is particularly enjoyable as almost every home features some form of decorative lighting either within a window, on the house and/or in its yard. Towns, cities and business establishments erect dazzling displays of ornamentation which light up the streets. Light is a vital component of life. Without it we could barely survive. When God first created our world. He blessed it with light. He dispelled the darkness of chaos and woke up the sleeping universe to a

glorious morning of trees, shrubs, green and golden meadows and blossoming orchards. God filled the skies with the indescribable hues of the dawn and the sunset, of fields alive with fruit, grain, beast and fowl and rivers teeming with fish that were to become our life-sustaining food. As that first light dawned, the stage was set for God's greatest creation - man and woman. On (December 25), we celebrate the dawn of another creation as the star of Bethlehem shines through the darkness of a world depressed by the long-enduring night of sin, unbelief and exile from its Creator. The star of Bethlehem announces the coming of Him Who is the Light of the World! The first light of creation ended physical darkness and the vast void of chaos. The second light of Christmas ends moral and spiritual darkness, the darkness of the soul shadowed in sin and brings enlightenment to every person who comes into this world. When Saint John wrote his gospel almost a hundred years after the holy birth of the Redeemer, he ties together that holy birth, the Christ of the Transfiguration, Christ glorious in His miracles and His teachings, Christ against the lowering sky of Good Friday's bloody sunset buried in a dark tomb, and Christ of the splendor and glory of promised Resurrection. By divine inspiration, Saint John pens these profoundly reverent words: "In Him was life, and the life was the light of men. And the light shines in the darknessHe is the true light that enlightens every person who comes into the world." (Cf. John 1:4, 5, 9). From the Christmas Vespers, our Church has us pray: "O Christ our God, Your kingdom is eternal, and Your reign is from generation to generation. You became incarnate of the Holy Spirit and became man from the ever-virgin Mary. Your coming, O Christ, has shed a great light upon us. You are the Light of Light and the radiance of the Father. You have illumined the whole creation. Therefore, everything that breathes sings a hymn of praise to You. You are the image of the Father's glory. You are the eternal God, existing before all ages, Who shone forth from the Virgin. O Lord, our God, have mercy on us." As for Saint John, so also for each of us, the holy birth of Christ is the dawn of new light once again, the dawn of powerful love and of great hope renewed at Christmas for all of us. As we share in this renewed love and hope, may its warm light bring you and yours happiness and peace now and through the New Year.

Sweet Child of Bethlehem, grant that we may share with all our hearts in this profound mystery of Christmas. Pour into the hearts of men the peace which they sometimes seek so desperately, and which you alone can give them. Help them to know one another better and to live as brothers, children of the same Father. Awaken in their hearts love and gratitude for your infinite goodness; join them together in your love; and give us all your heavenly peace. Pope Saint John XXIII
