# Time to act: Church teaches duty to intervene to prevent genocide

VATICAN CITY (CNS) -- Pope Francis has echoed a century of papal pleas: "No more war!" But, referring to the outrageous violations of human rights taking place in northeastern Iraq, he also begged, "Stop these crimes!" The Catholic Church for millennia has taught that war must be a last resort to resolve problems. But it continues to recognize the right of people to defend themselves and, particularly since the pontificate of St. John Paul II, the church has taught that the international community has an obligation to intervene -- with force, if necessary -- to defend the lives of innocent people at risk of genocide. "When all other means have been exhausted, to save human beings the international community must act. This can include disarming the aggressor," said
